I hate to tell you this but you aren't getting those things back. Second grade, we had a chinchilla. It's not every day you see a pet in a classroom. 28, the amount of kids we had in that class. That's Mrs. Fauxbel and. Ms. Salvas' worst nightmare but somehow they still loved us. Third grade, Hayden yelled "Get the knife!". Hunter came into school with one shoe on. I'm not sure how, but it is possible to forget a shoe. Fourth grade, we got our pen license. Fifth grade, we went to Mystic Aquarium for a field trip. While we were there we kept getting splashed by a whale named Juno. Sixth grade, we spent the last four months of our school year online. Seventh grade, we were all maturing. Well, maybe not for all of us. Remember when you stapled your finger, Alex. We dissected seven different things. A frog, a crayfish, a fish, a clam, a worm, a chicken wing, and a sheep eye.

It seems like just yesterday we stepped into this school for our first time, and now here we are on our graduation day.
