# DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR...

"Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe"

The roots of Christianity go far back to the intertwining of three great traditions of priesthood, prophecy, and kingship. All three are very strong in the Old Testament. And all three appear again in the New Testament. But somewhere along the way we seem to have lost the prophetic and priestly treads. And so we celebrate today the Feast of Christ the King.

We need to set our excitement within the framework of what Jesus replied when Pilate asked him if he was a King: He implied that he was a King but added that his Kingdom was not of this world. The readings today help us to understand what it means to be a true king. It is about shepherding, about gathering, about nurturing, about protecting. And there is the paradoxical application in the lives of the subjects: what we do to and for our King. Our King is not remote and above – he is imminent, among, with. Truly Jesus' kingship is not of this world. It is our greatest privilege to serve such a King as Jesus.

What is your understanding of a King? A King is someone who has power, money, fancy cars, a lot of servants, land and who dresses in expensive clothes. To show their authority they wear a crown and sit on a throne. I believe, we know the difference. And with no doubt we can say Jesus is a King who is Kind, loving, serving, humble and forgiving.

"To which king should I be loyal?" is not a question many of us face in modern times, but for both faithful Jews and followers of Jesus, it was a decision on which their lives could literally depend. We realize how relevant the question remains when we ask, "Who or what reigns in my life?" The answer determines both our present and future joy.

We have a king who has a heart. We have a king who understands. He cares for us even when he is hung on the cross. He forgives the one who says "sorry" for his or her mistakes. Let us continue to pray; "Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven".

# OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

# First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17

This passage beautifully describes how the Lord God, as shepherd, will tend his flock. He will rescue those who are lost, bring back those who stray, heal the sick, and "pasture" all.

# Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

Paul once again stresses the significance of Christ's resurrection in the total divine plan, emphasizing that Christ's rising means that those who believe in him will also rise after death. Christianity, he argues, is meaningless if it concerns only this life on earth. In the end, even death will be destroyed, and "God will be all in all."

# Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

With words both poetic and vivid, Jesus tells the disciples that since he is present in all people, whatever they do to "one of my least brothers" they do to him; and whatever they fail to do to his "least," they fail to do to him.
