FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR...

The season of advent is a time of preparation for Christmas. The whole season of Advent gives great hope for our lives: It is a time of joyful and spiritual expectation, and season of grace that invites us to examine the way we live our lives and to prepare ourselves to receive the Messiah. During this time, we reflect on the significance of the Incarnation and the promise of Christ's second coming. Advent serves as a spiritual journey, encouraging us to focus on hope, peace, joy, and love as we await the arrival of the Savior.

Each Sunday of Advent is associated with a specific theme represented by a candle on the Advent wreath. The first candle symbolizes hope, the second peace, the third joy, and the fourth love. The lighting of these candles in successive weeks adds a symbolic layer to the season, fostering a sense of progress and deepening reflection.

Advent is a constant reminder to us just like an alarm clock - We hear cries "Awake! Arise!" The season of Advent stresses the necessity for awakening and arising. It is a time of fervent preparation for prayer and sacrifice. It is a season of self-awareness. It is a time when we await the child Jesus into our broken world once again.

Advent is about letting Jesus come to us. We do the letting and Jesus does the coming. Advent is a time to see our life for what it is and to acknowledge our failures. The season of Advent opens up a series of promises and contains powerful images that remind us of God's unconditional love and challenges us to wake up from our sleep.

Our main focus at this season should be on the mystery of incarnation, the concrete act of God's Love. During this journey, the Church goes through a threefold experience of loneliness, hope and watchful waiting. Even in situations of crisis and struggles we have to believe that another world is possible. It is only who can see the invisible can do the impossible. We should have a deep sense of security and assurance during our journey of faith, a journey towards a new world of love, joy and peace.

As we begin the season let us open our hearts to experience the love of God and pray that we may have the courage to cast off the darkness of our lives and put on Christ the only reality needed for our lives. *Let us 'Watch! Be prepared! And be on our guard!'*

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 63:16b-17, 19b, 64:2-7

In this straightforward psalm, the people acknowledge their sinful ways, yet plead that their Creator might reveal himself to them. They ask God to remember, not their sins, but that "We are all the work of your hands."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul explains to the Corinthians that they are specially favored by God who has sent his only Son to them. He reminds us all that it was through God's grace that we have been called to kinship with Christ.

Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

Just as a servant watching over the master's house does not know when he will return, we do not know the hour of the Second Coming. Mark reminds us of the warning from Jesus to always be on guard, for we know not the day nor the hour.
