# THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

## DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR...

## "Rejoice in the Lord always"

The third Sunday of Advent is called *"Rejoice Sunday"* because the Mass for today begins with this opening antiphon: *"Rejoice in the Lord always."* To remind ourselves that we are preparing for the very joyful occasion of the birth of Jesus, we have the rose candle lit in the Advent wreath.

In today's readings Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist rejoice because they have Good News. God is with them and working through them. Isaiah is anointed by the Lord and sent to announce *a day of vindication by our God*. Paul encourages the Thessalonians to always rejoice, pray, and give thanks. John the Baptist testifies to the light and says he *is the voice of one crying out in the desert, "make straight the way of the Lord."* They are anointed, blessed, and sent to do God's will. On this Rejoice Sunday, we, too, find reason to rejoice. Our rejoicing should be in sharing the Good News of Christ.

Paul's letter to the Thessalonians fits the theme of this Sunday, "Rejoice in the Lord always." One important key to his suggestion is that all three parts of Christian practices are bound together in this reading. Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances, give thanks. So, joy, prayer, and gratitude – are all connected. Here is an invitation for all of us on this third Sunday of Advent.

Joy, for example, springs from gratitude. When we recall things, events, or people for which we are grateful our joy increases. A prayerful awareness of the world, and an attitude of prayerful attentiveness, makes it easier to see life's blessings. Joy moves us to prayer. That's why Paul says, "Rejoice always."

In the Gospel, John the Baptist is talking about this joy as part of preparing for the Lord. "Make straight the way of the Lord" means not physically leveling a path that Jesus can walk on; but bringing justice and awareness of God into the world, making things "right" with God, repenting on the greed, thinking about others, working for the greater good of the community. His message is not just a hopeful one, but a joyful one, as well.

Let us all look forward to a brighter future with hope, supporting each other through these difficult times, filled with peace and joy in our lives, and be full of love, both for God and for one another, at all times.

# THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

## First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

## Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to constantly ready themselves for Christ's arrival. He tells them to "avoid any semblance of evil" so that they may be found irreproachable when Jesus does arrive.

## Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John explains that he is only a messenger to the people for one more powerful than himself. John stresses to them that they must make a path for the one so powerful that he is not fit to unfasten the strap of his sandal.
