# DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR...

He is Risen, Alleluiah!

Easter is a time of rejoicing. It's the time that we all experience the peace and joy that the Risen Lord shares and looks to the future with Hope.

If we are the people of the Resurrection and new life, do we tend to be sad people? We can be negative and critical and discouraged bv concentrating on all the bad things that happens in life, and forget that Easter was the completion of Good Friday. Easter should be the fundamental attitude of our lives, rather than suffering. Too often we criticize others instead of praising them. We worry about all the bad things they do. We often live our lives in frustrated dreams and hopes, instead of being happy about all the good things. We can list all the faults of others. We worry about so many things and we find too few things to be happy about. We should live in the joy and hope of Easter. We should meet each day with a smile. We should not wake up each morning worried about what is going to happen in the coming day.

The Resurrection of Jesus gives us reason to hope. He died and He rose. Even more, Jesus has given us a share in that risen life. For in baptism we died with Him in sin and selfishness and rose with Him to goodness and grace. The Resurrection is our goal for heaven, our final homeland.

The mystery of Jesus' resurrection is so fundamental that it is not easy to express in words what it means to us. The beloved disciple, John, entered the tomb, saw and believed. In that emptiness he experienced the deepest possible faith. His goal from then on was to help others to experience the same. The responsibility that lies on us this Easter is the same: Proclaim the faith we have received.

The Resurrection of Jesus also tells us that we don't have to escape pain and death to achieve victory, we have only to remain faithful. God's day will come. So we wait in hope for God to do whatever he plans to do. The power of God can remove the stone that covers the tomb. Do not lose hope.

# EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

# First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, then he rose up and was seen by his chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through him.

# Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in him.

# Gospel: John 20:1-9

When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus'
