DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR...



Be ready for spiritual growth and renewal!

Today we see Jesus using the images of the Sower and the mustard seed to explain the

kingdom of God. Although seemingly small or insignificant, these examples demonstrate that great things can happen through the work of God. All our efforts in building the kingdom, even if they seem small, will be blessed by God.

The man scattered seed on the land. That is all he does. But night and day, even as he sleeps or is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing, how, he does not know. Growth is silent and secret. This is true also of the spiritual life, the kingdom of God within us. If unhindered and undisturbed, it grows silently, secretly, slowly. God gives the growth and the increase. He is at work.

"Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear." Growth is a small process. It takes time and moves in phases. No doubt growth is a miracle in slow motion. This is equally true of our spiritual life. We cannot be saints overnight. It takes an entire lifetime. "Above all trust in the slow work of God...And yet the law of progress is that it is made by passing through some stages of instability – and that it may take a very long time." (Teilhard de Chardin)

Like the mustard seed, growth has small beginnings but with expansive gentleness it invites others to rest and find shelter. Growth in the spiritual life begins in a small way but continues to expand. Growth is never for itself but for others.

This is a special day for our fathers and grandfathers. And I am honored to wish you all a happy Fathers' Day. We recognize your invaluable contributions and influence in our lives and thank you. The guidance, love, sacrifice, and the indispensable role you have played in our lives are cherishing moments. We express our love, gratitude, and appreciation. For some it is a day of remembrance and reflection, honoring the memory of fathers who have passed away. We assure you fathers, living and dead, our prayers and invoke our Heavenly Father's blessings on you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope this letter finds you and yours well. The Church in Central and Eastern Europe Collection – Supports the Church in more than twenty-five countries that are still struggling to recover from or actively engaged with combating oppressive rule. Programs covered consist of pastoral care, catechesis, renovations, and seminary formations, education, and poverty outreach. Your support helps the Church bring Christ's mercy to vulnerable people, such as war refugees, the poor, seniors, and people with disabilities.

Holy Land Collection - This collection assists the Franciscan Fathers and the Latin Patriarch in their ministry to pilgrims, in the maintenance of the Holy Places, and in their pastoral, charitable, educational, and social works which the Church supports and provides to native Christians in the Holy Land.
