DAYDREAMS OF PASTOR



The season of advent is a time of preparation for Christmas. The whole season of Advent gives great hope for our lives: It is a time of joyful and spiritual expectation, and season of grace that invites us to

examine the way we live our lives and to prepare ourselves to receive the Messiah.

We begin the season with the blessing of the Advent Wreath and the lighting of the first candle which represents hope. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent.

The season of Advent stresses the necessity for awakening and arising. St. Paul writes, "It is the hour now for you to awake from sleep... The day is at hand." If you have ever tried to stay awake when you are tired, you know it is not just an act of the will. You took means to stay awake: moving around, doing some work, engaging in a conversation.

Advent is about letting Jesus come to us. We do the letting and Jesus does the coming. It is a time of fervent preparation in prayer and sacrifice. It is a season of self-awareness. It is a time when we await the child Jesus into our broken world once again.

Our focus at this season should be on the mystery of incarnation, the concrete act of God's Love. The pilgrim Church moves with hope and during this journey, the Church goes through a threefold experience of loneliness, hope and watchful waiting. Even in situations of crisis and struggles we have to believe that another world is possible. It is only who can see the invisible that can do the impossible. We should have a deep sense of security and assurance during our journey of faith, a journey towards a new world of peace, joy and love.

In today's Gospel, the Lord likens his coming to that of a flood or a thief. His advent is something of a surprise. Are we prepared for that day of surprise? As we begin the season let us open our hearts to experience the love of God and pray that we may have the courage to cast off the darkness of our lives and put on Christ the only reality needed for our lives.

Wishing you all a Blessed Season of Advent!

The words of Isaiah urge all people to forsake war and to live in peace forever. The tone reaches a climax in the words, "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

Paul invites us to put away all the things of darkness and sin and to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

A comparison is made between the destruction caused by the flood in Noah's time and the need to be prepared for the second coming of Christ. "You must be prepared in the same way. The Son of Man is coming at the time you least expect."


